

Rules EJCT Thun

The tournament is played under the World Curling Federation rules of curling and rules of competition booklet 2011.

- The first named team will play the red coloured handled stones. To figure out the right of the last stone in the first end a toss will be thrown. To determine the last stone in the following matches, after each game a DSC will be played. The four best results out of five will be counted.
- All games last 8 ends with extra end if necessary. In the round robin games only one extra end will be played. If there is no score after this end the team who had the last stone loses the match.
- The round robin games will have a time of 115 minutes. The clock starts when the chief umpire starts the game. When time has expired, the last stone of the current end has to be played and the teams can play the last end. If the score is tied, the extra end starts immediately.
- One time-out per team of one minute is allowed during each game and one time-out in each extra-end. A break of maximum five minutes is allowed after the 4th end. No break is allowed between the last regular end and the extra end.
- Only brooms with pads approved by World Curling Federation are allowed.

The boys and girls will play a round robin in two groups. The first ranked team in each group will be qualified for the semi-final. The second and the third ranked teams are qualified for the quarter-finals. All teams will be ranked by number of wins. If two teams are tied, the team that won their round robin game will be ranked higher. When three or more teams are tied, the teams will be ranked by the DSC. Tie-break games will not be played.

In the quarter-finals, semi-finals and in the final game the team with the higher ranking (games won, DSC) will have the last stone in the first end or the choice of the colour of the stones.

When both teams have the same ranking one member of each team will play a practice shot and then a draw shot for button to determine the last stone at the first end or the colour of the stones. To save time teams will throw consecutively.

Price money will be awarded to the four semi-finalists in the girls and boys tournament. Total Price money is CHF 6'000.— (CHF 3'000.— for each tournament).
